Dear Resident

You may be aware from recent media coverage of proposals to build a biomass power plant in your area. Rose Energy comprises three of Northern Ireland's leading agri-businesses - O'Kane Poultry Ltd, Moy Park Ltd, and Glenfarm Holdings Ltd – and plans to build a green energy plant which will convert biomass material into electricity.
